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Safety Committee Minutes July 3, 2014

Members Present: Zach Leavy(arrived at 6:30pm), Susan McCallum and Todd Klahn (arrived at 6:50pm).
Also present Chief Harry Barger.

Meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm.

Z. Leavy moved to approve the June 5, 2014 minutes. 2nd by S. McCallum. Motion carried.

Chief Barger presented his draft after action report for Green County Dairy Days. Events were discussed in general including improvements for future events of this type. He appreciated the Chamber President inviting him and other Department heads to a planning meeting early on, attending safety committee meeting and continued email updates. He felt this could have been improved utilizing the proposed events permits the committee has been working to adopt.

Chief Barger presented his draft action report for the Brooklyn 2014 Fun/Run Walk, June 14. He was concerned there wasn't any sharing of information until the June Safety meeting when chair of the committee presented the route and plans.

The special board meeting on June 26 took care of the discussion regarding an animal control ordinance.

Chief Barger will be writing an after action report for the Fourth of July Celebration. He just received a map of the set-up in the park today from the Village President. He has not gotten any information regarding the Labor Day Celebration. He feels that if we had the event forms in place that there would be better overall communication and planning. S. McCallum will bring the topic up at board meeting to see if the board wants the committee to continue developing the process. Also the board has approved the committee to review liquor licenses, and the recent picnic licenses were not forwarded to the committee.

S. McCallum invited a representative from the Sno-Hornets to this meeting so we could have dialogue about the two tractor pulls in June that they sold beer. No one was able to attend. She will contact them for the August meeting.

The final draft of the CAPMAR response agreement was reviewed, Chief Barger showed and explained to the committee the appendix documents. The response grid has to be finalized. T. Klahn moved to recommend approval to the Village Board, 2nd Z. Leavy. Z. Leavy questioned the statement in the document by Dane County, but you will be using other counties? Barger replied yes and that is part of finalizing the grid. Motion carried.

Chief Barger informed the committee that he just received a letter from the sponsor of the "2014 Bike MS: Toyota Best Dam Bike Ride" they are bringing approximately 1,500 bicyclists through Brooklyn on August 3 between 8:30 am – 2:30pm. The letter referred to supporting document enclosures but there weren't any. Chief Barger will contact the person signing the letter for additional information. S. McCallum moved to recommend the Village Board approve the use of local streets for the event based upon receipt and satisfaction of Chief Barger with the missing documents, 2nd by T. Klahn. Motion carried.

The 2014 budget was reviewed.

The work schedule was reviewed, Officer Neubert has been approved to work part-time for the village but needs different gear from her full time position; once she has this she will be back on the schedule. Officer Burns has not been available for many hours due to his full time position in Belleville. Chief

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Barger has gotten 4 applications so far for part time staff, he would like to get a few more so that he has a good pool of candidates.

Under the Chief's Report current activity was reviewed. He spent Monday hand delivering the notice of our intent to consider leaving New World January 1st, 2015 to all partners. He worked with his IT person and determined it would be about \$10,000 in equipment to fix immediate technology issues. Tracs has a version 10 upgrade that the data terminal in the squad would not be able to handle.

S.McCallum moved to adjourn at 7:20pm, 2nd by T. Klahn. Motion carried.
